And we have more than our fair share in Jiangsu, with many in areas of outstanding natural beauty. In addition to the mineral-rich, piping-hot waters which surge from deep below, each pool is more often than not infused with a health-giving nutrient of one sort or another. Mostly Traditional Chinese Medicine is utilized for the purpose, but so are plants and some quite creative alternatives.

Suitably invigorated, we next take you to a couple of southern Jiangsu's famed water towns, the "Venice of the East" that is Zhouzhuang ancient town in Kunshan City and Xijin ferry ancient street in Zhenjiang City, where there is in fact, no ferry whatsoever.

In Marvellous Museums, we next invite you to breathe in China's history on both a national and local level, at the world-class museums in Nanjing, Suzhou, Yangzhou and Nantong. Be warned, this could take some time.

Looking now to cuisine. What food makes you think of winter? All over the world, the answer to that may be soup, and Jiangsu is no exception. For us, it's mutton soup in particular. Read on about this, and other winter delicacies such as fish head soup, pigeon eggs and tofu. And let's not forget to feed you that new year treat, those glutinous balls of rice known as "tang yuan."

Finally, and as it's the new year, in this issue we also break down the best places across the province to experience the Lantern Festival as our moon turns full.

Welcome to the Nanjing Olympic Sports Center's Ice Sports Club.





Drive or take a taxi to the first floor of the Nanjing Olympic Sports Center Gymnasium (pillar C59 in the parking lot). It is about 15 kilometers from Nanjing South Railway Station or Nanjing Railway Station, and takes about 35 minutes by car.

On the Nanjing Metro, get off at Olympic Sports East Station on Line 2 and it's 900 meters from Exit 2, or on Nanjing Metro Line 10, get off at Olympic Sports Center

e ice area of the rink is about 1,800 square meters. Advanced indirect refrigeration technology is used to make the rink, which can accurately adjust the temperature and hardness of the ice surface according to different sports requirements and can support various ice sports such as ice hockey, curling, figure skating and short track speed skating. A high-level coaching team is also an advantage of the ice sports club, with a number of retired athletes at the national level with rich teaching and practical experience. A second floor spectator area can accommodate 500 people, while a strength gymnasium provides a "one-stop" experience for fitness and leisure, artistic development and physical training.

Whether you are a beginner or an expert in ice sports, there's something for you here. Training courses are aimed at children from as young as three years, while ice sports enthusiasts also include adults. Starting from beginner skating, after mastering the necessary movements, you can transfer to basic ice hockey or figure skating, and then follow up with advanced or special

The dream is "engaging 300 million people in winter sports" and to start from the very young! The club cooperates with many primary and secondary schools to carry out ice physical education teaching all year round. It also has a number of youth ice hockey teams ranging from Under 6 to Under 14, and has achieved excellent results in many competitions held across the country. The ice sports club won the Under 6 2018 Sina Cup International Youth Ice Hockey Open group champion. Runner-up in the 2019 Women's National Ice Hockey Championship was the U12 team, while in the 2019 CCM City Cup Youth Ice Hockey Tournament, the U10s were group champions and the U8s were third runner-up in their group.

Ice sports fitness, training, competitions and school-enterprise ice games are the main businesses of the club. Since 2018, the Ice Sports Club has held the "City Cup" Ice Hockey Invitational Tournament every year, which has become a unique IP event for the club.

However, with the erection of the Usnisa Pagoda, the Usnisa Temple and the Usnisa Palace, Niushou Mountain has acquired an even more dreamy feeling after a winter snow Among them, the Usnisa Palace was built on an abolished mine, with a total height of 9 floors, 6 of which are located underground, and the bottom floor is where the parietal bone sarira of Sakyamuni Buddha is treasured. The overall shape of the building is a Mani dome with a giant lotus holding up the Buddha's parietal bone, with a diameter of more than 200 meters, which is splendid and spectacular. The interior design of the underground palace is also very beautiful and it's a good tourist destination.



And little wonder, given the rise of popularity in China for winter sports ahead of the Games, and the rink's location in the Suzhou Center Mall that is at present the city's largest mall, with some 300,000 square meters

A fitting place then for a Champion Rink facility. Dating back to 2000, the chain can be found in cities across China, offering citizens access to Olympic-standard ice rinks, for both recreational skaters and those looking for more professional options. According to Guo Ming, a manager at Champion Rink in Suzhou, the ice rink business has a few eccentricities,

namely keeping the rink cold enough

so that the ice does not melt. Specifically, a month's electricity bill can run to between two and three hundred thousand yuan.

Then there are the professional coaches, offering both skating and ice hockey instruction, many of whom with distinction merits to their name. Suzhou Center Mall won the MAPIC Award for "Best New Shopping Center" in 2018, being recognized for its innovation and quality in the global retail real estate industry.

A Winter Visit To The Classical Gardens Of Suzhou


Leaves A Fragrant Memory With Wintersweets

Plum blossoms might not be as white as snow, but they have a fragrance that snow does not have.



n the ancient city, walking on the snow and feasting one's eyes on plum blossoms leave such a poetic experience. The classical gardens of Suzhou are not only the city card of Suzhou, but also a masterpiece of art polished by time. Walking into the garden is like stepping into a natural landscape filled with diverse scenery, beautiful at all seasons. In winter, the pond water freezes and plum blossoms exude a magnificent fragrance. If it happens to snow, it is truly the most elegant place in the city.



Humble Administrator's Garden

is one of the four famous gardens in China. The first scent of winter here comes from wintersweet distributed in the south of the Raindrops Pavilion, the east of the Eighteen Stramonium Flowers Hall, and the west of the Floating Green Tower. When the flowers are in bloom, the fragrance is pleasant.

Surging Waves Pavilion was named a world heritage site by UNESCO. When visiting the Surging Waves Pavilion in winter, you will find branches of wintersweet jump before your eyes through the perforated windows from behind the white corridor wall. Outside each window is a tree of wintersweet with different shapes, filling the garden with fragrance. The cold aroma is so refreshing that it will make you stop and indulge yourself in it.

Lion's Grove Garden holds the
Spring Plum Exhibition every year when
the Spring Festival draws near. More
than ten varieties of plum blossoms
including palace pink, cinnabar, green
plum, red plum, jade butterfly and so on
are placed in the Ancestral Hall, Yanyu
Hall, Yifeng Zhibai Pavilion, Flower
Basket Hall and Wisteria Corridor,
showing the elegant plum blossoms
blooming against the cold air.

In the Master-of-Nets Garden, on

the yellow stone rockery by the pond in the middle of the garden stands a wintersweet with sloping branches and beautiful flowers. In the small courtyard in front of Tiyun Room, before the gate of the Xiaoshan Conggui Pavilion, and in front of the small Wufeng Bookstore are all lined with wintersweets, which are extremely beautiful.

Drive or take a taxi to Sunac Mao, No. 66, Sunac Cultural Tourism City, Binhu District, Wuxi City. It is about 26 kilometers from Wuxi Station, taking about 35 minutes by car.

Or take Wuxi Metro Line 1 and get off at Gedaigiao Station. Walk about 500 meters from Exit 4.



uxi Sunac Snow World is located in Sunac Cultural Tourism City. As a large indoor ski resort integrating snow entertainment and skiing, it occupies a total area of 17,500 square meters, of which 10,000 square meters are devoted to recreational and ski areas. The primary ski run has a length of 138 meters and a maximum drop of

As soon as you enter the venue, cold air rushes into your nostrils, as the temperature here is minus six degrees Celsius all day long. A snow entertainment area specially designed for young children covers takes up about 5,600 square meters, to provide for little ones snow play areas and small gentle slopes. Therein, children can practice skiing under the guidance of their parents and enjoy fun activities in the

In recent years, the Snow World has not only held a series of ice and snow events, such as the "Digital Ice and Snow Games," but also set up special courses for different groups, including youth ski camps, research studies, youth competitive teams and quality education courses. Also worthy of mentions that Wuxi Sunac Cultural Tourism City also includes Wuxi Sunac Sea World, and Wuxi Sunac Water World, making it a one-stop colorful paradise for families to check

Turning this place into a snow-covered world are 18 refrigeration units, five snow machines, two snow drifting ma-

chines and five magic carpets. Such a magic land of Nordic-style ice and snow has been planted here, south of the Yangtze River, so that tourists can enjoy it even on the hottest summer day. In this "dance of ice and snow," visitors can enjoy a carnival in the snow at Sunac Snow World in Wuxi, one not limited by season and space, and where they can take plenty of winter scenery photo-

White Snow Decorated With Green Bamboo

ixing Bamboo Sea Scenic Area in Wuxi City, spanning across the three provinces of Jiangsu, Zhejiang and Anhui, covers an area of about 15,000 hectares. It is one of the representative scenic spots of Chinese bamboo landscape and bamboo culture. Bamboo is evergreen in all seasons, so that the bamboo sea after snow in winter is checkered with green and white, which is particularly attractive.

In the bamboo sea, mountain stream water and natural rainwater converge to form a small "mirror lake." It is home to the 1.5 billion-year-old coelenterate Craspedacusta, a treasure among freshwater jellyfish, is known as the "giant panda in water." The Jellyfish Pavilion in the corner of "mirror lake" is the best place to observe the Craspedacusta. But if you want to see their grand gathering, summer and autumn are the best seasons, when the jellyfish are most active.

Getting there:

Travel to Xuzhou Dugong Mountain Ski Park by car or taxi.

urrounded by mountains on three sides, Xuzhou Dugong Mountain Ski Park is located in Dugong Lake Scenic Area in Jiawang District of Xuzhou City, and covers an area of more than 80,000 square meters. The snow here is soft, which is a good place to feel the all the fun it offers and enjoy skiing.

Perfect for snowboards, skis and other fun equipment, visitors can choose ski trails according to their level, or just play in the snow. The snow trails here are built on the mountains, with a minimum drop of 2.4 meters and a maximum of 40 meters. The primary trail is about 220 meters long, while the intermediate and undulating trails are 260 meters long and the advanced level about 600 meters long.

Equipment available for the visitors includes snowmobiles, balanced snow bikes, children's snow scooters, children's

snowboards and more. Gambol freely on the snow, competing with each other or challenging yourself.

Dugong Mountain Ski Park also has a 3,000-square-meter ski hall, more than 3,000 imported skis and ski boots, 500 snow discs and more than 10 snowmobiles. Parking is convenient, with nearly 20,000 square meters of spaces, while dining is available in the tourist service center, seating 300 people. The service center also provides tourists with sightseeing trips, skiing services and much more.

After an energetic day of skiing, soak in the comfortable hot springs, at Xuzhou Longshan Hotel just eight kilometers from the park. A hot springs tourist resort that integrates hot spring bathing, leisure health, eco-tourism, dining, and entertainment, the hotel has more than 30 kinds of hot spring pools, such as Traditional Chinese Medicine, Yao bath, wine bath, flower bath and milk bath.

Combining indoor and outdoor hot springs, tourists can soak in hot natural water, relieving the fatigue of skiing. Also worthy of mention are the various other activities, such as white water rafting, paragliding, beach motorcycles, horse riding, boat cruises and children's playgrounds in the vicinity of Xuzhou Dugong Mountain Ski Park.

Xuzhou Han Culture Scenic Spot boasts Han tombs, Han Terracotta Warriors and Han stone reliefs, which are representatives of the China's Han culture. The core area is composed of the cultural essence of the two Han dynasties such as the mausoleum of a Chu State king in Lion Mountain, Han Terracotta Warriors Museum, and Han Stone Relief Corridor. It is a display of the cultural relies collections of the Han Empire that was contemporary with the ancient Roman Empire.

The sculpture in the picture was created based on the Han stone relief *Traveling on Carriages and Horses* which represents the high traveling standard of the Chu State king as a vassal king, echoing the mausoleum of a Chu State king. Against the background of the thin snow, the sculpture shows an even more vigorous and pioneering spirit of the Han culture.

o enjoy the snow, you need to climb the Yunvu Peak of Huaguo Mountain, the highest peak in Jiangsu with an altitude of 624.4 meters. Looking up the sky and overlooking the earth, you'll enjoy both its real and illusory scenery: crystal clear rime all over the smoggy mountain in a surging sea of clouds and dancing snow sparkling under the sunlight. The flying snowflakes, falling on the branches, whiten the mountain peaks and ennoble the flowing water, scattering cleanness and tranquility over the famous mountain. Rime, cedar, icicle and ice cascade all together add a special charm to the beauty of Huaguo Mountain.

After the snow, the Yunyu Peak of Huaguo Mountain would become a world of colored glass and a crystal fairy palace, just like the fairy tale world in Frozen. When the snow falls on mountains, in canvons and forest ravines of Yunvu Peak, it feels like a poem of the Tang Dynasty; when it falls on the red wall of the Sanyuan Palace, it's like a song of Song Dynasty; when it falls into the blessed spot in Shuilian Cave, it's like a piece of Han folk song. Come here in winter and you will encounter the gentle snow, the fragrant and elegant wintersweet, and the joyful playfulness of the "Kinglet" macaques.

Jump into "Frozen" on "Antarctic Island"

In Jiangsu Province, an Antarctic world awaits. The exciting Limar Strait flying slides, the thrilling Calafate Glacier Tunnel, Icelandic ballet, and Penguin Island sledding... These can all be experienced in Dino Water Town's Nanjidao Park in Changzhou.








You can drive or take a taxi to 18 Dino Creative Park, 60 Hehai East Road, Xinbei District, Changzhou City. Antarctic Island Ice and Snow Park is about 7 kilometers from Changzhou Station, taking about 25 minutes by car.

Or take bus numbers 50, 53, 99, 302, or 527, get off at Dinosaur City Bus Hub Station, and then walk for 500 meters.



Glaciers come in a variety of shapes, some like beasts and flying birds, some like carved relief figures, some as sharp swords, and some resembling corals. Passing through the glacier tunnel, see the bizarre glacier world, experience the color of a magical crossing in the time tunnel, and enjoy the visual feast that is the snow mountain canyon.

A heart-pounding ice and snow tour shall be your reward for climbing the 6-meter-high ice slide, to then ride a snow-ring down the 80-meter-long curving slide. Also lying in wait are the mysterious bendy undulating slide, and the excitement of driving a bumper car on the wide ice. Feel the dread of "imminent collision" and the thrill of "overtaking,"

satisfying your racing heart and a sense of madness in the ice and snow world. The Kunlun Station of the Antarctic Scientific Expedition is another attraction, but one very much grounded in the real South Pole. China Kunlun Station is China's first science station in inland Antarctic. Like being in a strange paradise, you can take photos with sculptures of scientific expedition members holding the nation's flag, and feel the arduous work of the members in this expedition for the motherland. What is an ice core? What is an ice shelf? What does the aurora look

learning, but also a great place to be entertained. Through the Antarctic science wall in the park, you can not only learn about the animals of the polar regions, but also the types of whales in the Antarctic waters, and members of the penguin family. In addition to improving your polar science knowledge, you can also participate in the Antarctic Island DIY ice sculpture class, most suitable for families with children to explore this mysterious southernmost part of the earth together.


Nanjing's Mine Valley Encounter with Hot Springs

he reason why Banyan Tree Nanjing Garden Expo is so eye-catching is largely due to its location. The Banyan Tree Nanjing Garden Expo is built in the Yunchi Dream Valley in Jiangsu Garden Expo Park, which in turn is in an abandoned mine. By turning the pit and industrial relics into a scenic garden, it has become a new landmark in Nanjing.

Jiangsu Garden Expo Park is surrounded by Zijin Mountain, Qixia Mountain, Baohua Mountain and Tangshan Mountain. With convenient transport and superior location, it is one of the region's newest and most popular tourist destinations.

The main part of Banyan Tree Nanjing Garden Expo is located on the easternmost side of Tangshan Mine Valley. Its unique geographical location enables a quiet natural environment and yet a broad view overlooking the entire Yunchi Dream Valley. The meandering hotel building above the mine valley is like a bridge connecting the two ends of the mine cliff wall.

Getting there

Drive or take a taxi. Vehicles enter from the east gate of Jiangsu Garden Expo Park, and then follow the signs. The hotel is about 34 kilometers from Nanjing Railway Station and Nanjing South Railway Station, about 50 minutes by car. It's 60 kilometers from Nanjing Lukou Airport, about an hour by car.

Elements such as light, stone, forest and rain are reshaped here, forming a spectacular "secret mine valley." The hotel is surrounded by themed gardens, and because it is close to the cliff, you can also see the misty waterfall cascading down from the top, resembling a fairyland. The three highlights that are the Deep Pit



Is It a Museum or a Hotel?

he Ruralation Museum Hotel in Tangshan stood out from nearly 800 projects around the world recently, when it won the Best Luxury Hotel at the 17th American "Hotel Design" magazine award ceremony in 2021, the first Chinese hotel to win this honor. You deserve the chance to find out why it was so.

Located in the eastern foothills of Purple Mountain in the outer suburbs of Nanjing, Nanjing Tangshan Hot Springs are well-known at home and abroad. In the early 1990s, the 600,000 year old "Nanjing Ape Man" skull (Homo erectus nankinensis) was found there, and so Tangshan-Fangshan National Geopark, with the themes of Tangshan Ape Man Cave, geological profiles, hot springs and Neogene volcanoes (late tertiary period), was established.

Getting there

Some 50 minutes by car or taxi, the hotel is about 30 kilometers from Nanjing Railway Station or Nanjing South Railway Station. Nanjing Lukou Airport is 60 kilometers away, which will take 70 minutes by car.





Spa Resort Near Prehistoric Ruins

The Ruralation Museum Hotel is located in Tangshan Homo Erectus Site Park, in an abandoned quarry beside the Nanjing Homo Erectus Site Museum. The exposed cliff walls of the mine have become the natural barrier and a rough backdrop to the building. The mountains around the quarry have undergone ecological challenges in recent years, and have therefore undergone restoration and emergency management.

The impressive hotel is built of local stone and the binding white "cement" was excavated during the laying of the foundations. Inspired by the Tangshan Geopark geology and the mysterious Tangshan Ape Man, Ruralation Muse-

um Hotel creates a place with a sense of history, allowing us to feel the evolution of nature over the march of time. This hot springs resort hotel has 39 rooms in five categories; classic courtyard rooms, courtyard villas, family villas, mountain view villas and VIP custom villas. High-class facilities include Chinese and Western restaurants, meeting and multi-function venues, library, design exhibition hall, gym, meditation space, grass covered activity area and outdoor swimming pool.

Under chimney-like roofs, each room has its own hot spring pool. While so luxurious and relaxing to soak in steaming hot-springs water and admire the night sky, the daytime sky is often an azure blue.

Through a long corridor to the cavelike front hall, the hotel entrance seems ceremonial; it feels like you are being pulled back to an era before modern humans walked the earth. Eighteen steps, seemingly made of light, further strengthen a feeling of space and a change of time when entering. Above the spacious rotunda lobby, a colorful web woven with hemp ropes allows space for the visitor to view the clear sk

Your palate is going to be tempted, teased and fulfilled. The hotel offers Huaiyang, Zhejiang and Jiangsu boutique dishes, selected coffee, and handmade desserts, as well as the chef's selection of "creative cuisine without borders." An important part of the immersive experience is the hotel setmenu dinner, inspired by Michelin star chefs, presenting new-concept fusion dishes, drawing on local ingredients and infused by the atmosphere of Tangshan's surrounding stones and hot springs. Eleven dishes include "Tangshan clouds and fog," with potted, golden-pumpkin cheese salad, and secret flame-grilled beef cooked on a drilled-wood fire Other romantic delicacies do more than feed you, until you feel that you are taking part in a ceremony. The meal is not complete without the Tangshan craft beer, made with water taken from the ancient springs.

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Meet the City Center "Prehistoric" Open-air Spa

he book "Dinosaur Empire" by American artist, James Gurney, tells the story of explorers encountering an undiscovered paradise. On this lost island, deep canyons, cascading waterfalls and tranquil lakes are surrounded by verdant forests. People and dinosaurs live in harmony, enjoying themselves, wandering in the beautiful lost world.



Getting there

By car or taxi, the hotel is about 8 kilometers from Changzhou Railway Station and Changzhou North Railway Station, taking about 20 minutes. Back in reality, James Gurney's world view of this "harmonious coexistence of humans and dinosaurs" in the book was the design inspiration for the Changzhou Dinosaur Valley Hot Spring Hotel.

Designers from Japan, Canada, Germany and China's Taiwan have made this place into one of the few prehistoric themed hot spring resort centers in China.

With open-air hot springs, stone pavilions, small bridges and flowing water, the hotel is a real paradise located in the city. Hidden in amongst the lush greenery, there are nearly 40 open-air pools of different sizes at the hotel, and each offers a degree of privacy. The Southeast Asian style of the garden layout makes it both classical and romantic. Dino-

saur-themed pools, pools with skin-nibbling fish, romantic couple pools; each has its own characteristics. While in the hot-spring waters, you can close your eyes to rest or chat with companions, just like being in a paradise.

The hot waters here are drawn from the Triassic strata at a depth of over 2,000 meters, from a time some 250 million years ago, while the water temperature exceeds 55 degrees Celsius all year round. The waters are also extremely rich in minerals, especially rare strontium and metasilicic acid, exceeding international medical thermal mineral standards.

The largest hot spring pool in the hotel is called "Dragon Pool." Here, the sky is the ceiling, while the immersive scene blends together. A huge stegosaurus sculpture looms over, accompanied by the 3D effect of trees, flowers and streams, and the sound of bird song. Every weekend, the hotel invites resident singers to perform on the water stage, each performer bringing a different feeling to the guests.

Red wine pool, petal pool, aloe pool and milk pool are special pools prepared by the hotel for female guests. In addition, there are private pools that provide separate and private space, and artificially created cave-like saunas are also of interest. All together, Changzhou Dinosaur Valley Hot Spring Hotel offers a unique leisure and cultural experience.

Between the Nanshan Bamboo Sea and the Yushui Hot Springs, Liyang Yushui Bamboo Valley Hotel is located to take maximum advantage of both sides of the valley. The view is so wide, it feels that you can see thousands of kilometers, while the scene of clouds, lakes and mountains is unobstructed.

he hotel has fifty villas, each with its own hot spring pool and a swimming pool. The villas can also be rented as 120 individual rooms. Standing on the balcony of the hotel, you can admire the nearby bamboo forests, or in the distance, watch the sunset and a sea of clouds

The layout of each room is leisurely and elegant; every flower and scene is very poetic, especially the landscaping on the balcony. Just as a sparrow is a small bird, but still is complete, each room has everything you need, and also comes with Japanese-style decor. Fun among the Pines

at Donghai Forest Spa Resort

he first order of business for most people upon arriving at Donghai Forest Spa Resort and after checking in is a drink.

Not any old drink. Outside the complex lies a well; its geothermal waters come up from a depth of 2,000 meters underground.

In the distance, an extinct volcano reminds as to why we are here; to feel our planet's geology and and the lava of its mantle at work

Sprawling over 10,000 mu (670 hectares) an hour to the west of Lianyungang City itself, the Qingsongling Forest Park is home to a multitude of nature-based attractions, star among which is the Donghai Forest Spa Resort.

Eight years in the making, the resort consists of a 350-room hotel, spa leisure club, outdoor forest spa, large swimming pool, children's play park, lavender garden and farmland. Nearby are also a host of options for outdoor leisure and entertainment. The resort is in fact not just a spa destination, it is also ideal for conferences and corporate team







building activities.

As for the spa itself, each day 3,000 tons of nutrient-rich water each day, courtesy of Mother Nature, emerge from the resort's depths. More than 60 trace elements therein promote vasodilation, can lower blood pressure, speed up the metabolism and enhance digestion. The waters, with a PH value of 8.69, can also have a positive effect on arthritis, asthma, gynecological diseases and skin disorders.

With a forest coverage of 92%, the pine trees enveloping the entire resort are a top attraction in themselves. Many European or North American readers shall find themselves reminded of home.

The trees themselves and their unmistakable scent are the backdrop to a truly unique spa experience, particularly in the dead of winter. From the changing area, walk in your swimsuit through the trees along paths made from old grind stones to choose your own particular spa. Shall it be one of the more traditional plunge pools containing Traditional Chinese Medicine or are you willing to push the boat out and try the ginger or red-wine infused pools? Donghai has 30-plus pools to choose from.

In the warmer months, perhaps a snooze in one of the many hammocks strung

between two pine trees nearby before taking the plunge. The hammocks may not be so beckoning in winter but in exchange, this is the time of year when the magic happens.

Given its location, the fresh air all around provides for an incomparable night-time view of the stars in the heavens, while the steam from the hot waters waft you by. The fact that winter often provides the clearest skies combines with the concept of outdoor bathing in sub-zero temperatures to make for an experience that is almost out of this world.

A very short walk from the hotel and spas, you shall find a two-bedroom, secluded VIP private retreat, with thatched roofs and its own hot plunge pools is as little as just over 1,000 yuan per night.

Once submerged in the health-giving waters, novice winter spa goers may fear the moment when they must eventually get out. But there is nothing to worry about. With your innards thoroughly

> warmed, exiting the waters and into winter's bite is almost unnoticeable. In fact, some even will not even bother to don their robe for the walk back to the changing area.

> Afterward, a thoroughly deep sleep is in store. And a needed one, for on day two, many will look to fill their day with exhilarating activities of one sort or another, and all among the never-ending pine trees

> This is where we find an exceptionally-cute mini wooden rollercoaster for the little ones, a 600-meter go karting track for those a little older, and for the grown ups who are still very much young at heart, a five-kilometer dirt track on which to test themselves driving fourwheel, petrol-driven, off-road buggies.

> Elsewhere, a small archery range sits beside a firing range equipped with large-

scale futuristic compressed-air gatling guns. If that's a bit aggressive for some, there are also 150 "Starry Sky Tents," that are essentially plastic bubbles, offering both protection from the elements and a view of the stars above.

Worth a final mention is also the local cuisine. As much is possible, produce for resort guests is bred and grown on site; during low season, excesses of strawberries, grapes, water melons, a large array of vegetables and even peanuts are sold outside in local markets.

TIPS

Donghai Forest Hot Spring Resort is a 45-minute drive from Donghai County Railway Station , from where the Xuzhou East Railway Station hub is 52 minutes away by high-speed train. From Nanjing, the resort is a four-and-a-half-hour drive.

To visit when the skies are overcast would be to miss out on the greatest opportunity for smog-bound city dwellers. Try to plan a trip for when there is a good chance of clear skies offering pollution-free views of the heavens.





Take a traditionally-rowed boat along winding canals and watch as the shore scenery passes by Stroll through Zhenfeng Twelve Square to see the twelve original examples of intangible cultural heritage, thus taking simple and mellow memories of the water town with you.

Other must-see attractions include Shen Hall, Zhang Hall, Ancient Stage, Zhouzhuang Museum, and Zhouzhuang Double Bridge, showing the history of Zhouzhuang. Of course, don't forget to try Wansanho cooked pork trotters, grandmother tea, and various snacks, such as rice cakes, all of which are full of the unique taste of the town.

About five kilometers from Zhouzhuang ancient town is Xiangcun Qizhuang, surrounded on three sides by lakes and nestled beside the river. The Hefengli restaurant in the village uses the freshest local ingredients, while in the "Time Show" home-style hotel, enamel cups, old desk lamps, and suitcases from the past evoke the sense of local people's lives of decades ago.

Drink a cup of tea in Xiangcun's study, take a walk in the fields and learn to make handmade cakes from the old ladies of the village. This slow life, known as "returning to the garden and living in the garden," will become addictive!

Tongli town in Suzhou is surrounded by five lakes which becomes even more poetic in the winter. In the town, the three parallel rivers divide the town into seven small islands connected by ancient bridges, making it a real picture of "small bridges and flowing waters."

When you visit Tongli in winter, the Tuisi Garden is the place to go - the only World Cultural Heritage in the ancient towns of Jiangnan (regions south of the Yangtze River), where you will feel a full sense of happiness in the warmth of the winter sun. In the Pearl Pagoda scenic spot, you should listen to the Tanci (storytelling to the accompaniment of stringed instruments) of Pearl Pagoda, a play of the Qing Dynasty about the love story of Sun Fangqing and Chen Cui'e. And then you may enjoy a cup of heart-warming fragrant tea in the South Garden Teahouse.

Between Tongli and Zhouzhuang ancient towns, there is a Tongli National Wetland Park. There are rivers and ditches, lakes and marshes scattered all over the place, surrounded by rows of metasequoia trees and camphor trees, as well as large areas

of dense bamboo forests and various rare plants. Come here in winter and you will get the chance to encounter migratory birds from Russia's Siberia, north China's Inner Mongolia, as well as the northeast and northwest areas of China. Falcated ducks, spot-billed ducks, green-winged ducks, pintails... Thousands of anseriformes birds live and forage here, presenting a unique scene of the wetland park.



Huishan Ancient Town A Potential World Cultural Heritage Site

Huishan has many cultural relics and monuments, including ancient streets, gardens, temples, springs, academies, poetry societies, ancestral halls and many other traditional cultural resources, spanning thousands of years throughout history.

Built more than 600 years ago, the Jichang Garden is located in the ancient town of Huishan. It was built by a retired official who returned to Wuxi during the Ming Dynasty. "Jichang," as the name implies, means that people should be happy. Therefore, when you come to such an elegant garden, you should let go of your boredom and enjoy the classical life in a quiet

The streets of the ancient town are also full of traces of intangible cultural heritage, and the studios of the intangible cultural heritage inheritors of Huishan clay figurine and Wuxi fine embroidery are also located here. The Huishan clay figurines are small and cute, and are popular for tourists. The fine embroidery is done by dividing a single thread into 70 to 80 pieces, which gives it a high artistic value. The Ancient Ancestral Hall Cluster is also worth visiting. The family culture connected by blood is one of the traditional Chinese cultures, and the ancestral hall is the place where each family worships their ancestors. Currently, Huishan ancient town is applying for "Jiangnan Ancient Water Towns" World Cultural Heritage together with more than ten other ancient towns in Jiangsu, Zhejiang and Shanghai.



aowan is the most beautiful one among hundreds of bays along the Grand Canal. Yaowan ancient town is located in the southwest corner of Xinyi City, Xuzhou, Jiangsu Province. It is surrounded by water on three sides, with the Grand Canal to the west and Luoma Lake to the east. In winter, the ancient town of Yaowan is increasingly gentle and quiet, like an ancient ink landscape painting. The unique cluster of ancient dwellings in Yaowan is eye-catching. It has both the stability and decency of northern architecture, and the elegance and dexterity of southern architecture, being characterized by curved streets and lanes, deep houses and large courtyards. The streets of the ancient town are paved with blue flagstones and lined with shops. The flowing water go around the city whereas the stone bridges and small boats remain unchanged.

Sitting in a tea house, you can enjoy a piece of the canal Qinshu (storytelling in the form of singing, with musical accompaniment) by which the performers tell the unique life stories in the ancient town with their skillful singing and rich emotions. When you are stepping on the blue flagstones, walking along the old streets and crossing the ancient bridges, the rhythm of the Qinshu will echo in your ears from time to time. As the Spring Festival approaches, the atmosphere of New Year is getting stronger in the ancient town of Yaowan, which is located at the bend of the Grand Canal. Colorful performances, Chinese style parade, New Year's bazaar, dragon and lion dance... all these traditional folk activities are performed in a brand new way to start the carnival of the Year of the Tiger. Winter is also a time to taste Yaowan boat food. You can invite a couple of friends to meet at a boat restaurant, enjoy the meal of steaming hot rice and fresh river food casserole, and have cordial talks. You can also try the mung bean flavor alcoholic drinks, sweet oil, osmanthus cakes and other snacks, every bite of which is a treat to your taste buds. Nothing is more enjoyable than a small reunion with your families and friends by savoring a bite of seasonal river food from a warm pot.

In a mutton restaurant in Xuzhou, you can see customers everywhere holding a bowl of mutton soup with their left hands and a pancake with their right. Hold a bowl of hot Xuzhou mutton soup, pick up a piece of mutton that is tender and soft with your chopsticks and put it into your mouth, you will feel a burning hot sensation at the tip of your tongue yet satisfied with the tasty and nourishing meat. Xuzhou people have also created local famous dishes such as mutton stewed with fish.

Suzhou people also love mutton and cook it well. In addition to the most widely known Cangshu Mutton, other dishes like Dongshan Boiled Mutton and Zhenze Mutton have their own distinctive flavors. To cook authentic Cangshu Mutton, barrels made of the cedar wood from the Qionglong mountain of Cangshu Town are mostly

Republican-period Nanjing Cuisine— Stewed Chicken

Stewed Chicken is a traditional dish of Jinling cuisine. It was once one of the four famous dishes of Nanjing, but nowadays it is rare to find in the market. The chicken thighs are boned and beaten to break the fiber for seasoning. Then, the seasoned mince is spread on the chicken, wrapped with whipped egg whites and fried on low heat to give it the white snowball appearance. Next, the simmered chicken is put into the chicken broth and stewed for one hour. Finally, the freshness of the broth is incorporated into the chicken, and the chicken floats on the surface of the broth with a mellow taste and crispy texture.

➤ Steamed pigeon eggs with chopped shrimps - the dish is extremely labor-intensive and uses the shrimps from Gaoyou Lake processed with complex cutting and stirring techniques. The dish looks beautiful with pigeon eggs and shrimps in delicate colors while tasting tender and juicy.

Interesting Folklore Activities in Jiangsu on Spring Festival

The Chinese New Year or the Spring Festival is a traditional Chinese festival that has now become a global event. Dragon and lion dances, couplets and firecrackers, and delicious food are probably the most intuitive perceptions you have of Chinese New Year. It's true that most Chinese people participate in the above activities during the Spring Festival, but if you focus on a specific place in China, you will find some more interesting folklore activities during the festival.

n Jiangsu, people like to use lanterns to express their satisfaction and respect for the Spring Festival, whether it is the Nanjing Qinhuai Lantern Festival with a history of more than a thousand years, or the "pasta lanterns" made by villagers in Mazhuang, Xuzhou City, or the modern Changzhou Lantern Festival. The brightness and warmth represented by lanterns has always been the expectation of the Jiangsu people for the New Year.

In addition to lanterns, people in various cities of Jiangsu also have their own special Spring Festival folklore. Villagers of Wansui town in Changzhou perform the 1,600-year-old "Wansui Monkey Lanterns" during the Spring Festival. People in Dongshan and Xukou towns in Suzhou bring out the statues of the "Warrior God" that are usually enshrined in temples and parade them along the road to pray for the residents. In Funing County of Yancheng, people gather in the square to perform shows and whip the clay ox to pray for a good harvest in the coming year. These special folk activities preserve the good expectations of the ancestors of Jiangsu for life, and inspire the contemporary Jiangsu people to better protect traditional culture and continue the cultural succession.

Brace Yourself for the Qinhuai Lantern Festival

There are some things in life that you must do at least once. And if you live in Nanjing, the Lantern Festival in Fuzimiao is one such thing. Imagine an absolutely dazzling array of lights, showering boats, trees, a part of the city wall, bridges and buildings. Of course, many are lanterns in a traditional form, but with modern technology, LEDs are everywhere. But be prepared for wall-to-wall people!

ccurring on the fifteenth day of the new year in the lunar calendar, the Lantern Festival coincides with the full moon, and marks the end of the Spring Festival, although in our modern world people have returned to work about a week before this. A favorite time for young and old alike, eating out,

solving riddles, and dressing for the occasion, while as people are mostly outside the home, the streets will be busier than usual. While the focal point is Fuzimiao, the Confucius Temple in Qinhuai District, parks and gardens all over the city do their bit, so go for an amble just about anywhere. Being a festival, a special food is a must.





Tangyuan is a small ball made from glutinous rice, the sticky stuff, and filled with a paste such as sweet red bean, sesame, or even something similar to peanut butter. It can be boiled, fried or steamed, and it is commonly served in a bowl of sweet broth. The round shape of the balls and the bowls are believed to symbolize family togetherness, so eating tangyuan will bring family harmony, happiness, and luck in the year to come. Family dinners, presumably more joyful than usual, will feature this delicacy, and most restaurants will have it on the menu at this time.

The traditions have their roots over two millennia ago, but supposedly only became popular a little later when Emperor Ming, a proponent of Buddhism, saw that the Buddhist monks would decorate temples with lanterns on the fifteenth day of the first lunar month. This inspired him to tell all households, temples, and royal buildings to light lanterns on that evening. Thus, over time, it developed into a folk custom, and gradually expanded until it is the blazing spectacle we love today. Another possible origin is the ancient celebration of "the decreasing winter darkness" and the ability

to go out at night with the aid of lanterns. Indeed, for some people, to go for a walk holding a lantern is an essential part of the festival.

Of course, the ancient gods feature in

many stories and legends connected to the festival. One such tale tells of a beautiful crane that flew from heaven down to earth. When it was hunted and killed by some villagers, the Jade Emperor in heaven was furious as the crane was his favorite. He planned to send a firestorm against the village on the fifteenth day of the lunar month. The emperor's daughter warned the people of her father's plan to destroy their village. The people were panic-stricken until a wise man from another village suggested that everyone should light street bonfires, hang red lanterns on their houses, and explode firecrackers for three days. On the fifteenth day, warriors sent down from heaven saw that the village was already blazing, and returned to heaven to report its destruction to the Jade Emperor. The village was saved, and now the traditions live on; well, except for the fireworks which are frowned on these days.

Nanjing's Fuzimiao is beckoning if you

want the ultimate experience of the Lantern Festival. Much more than just lanterns, the vista of light has become a social artistic expression. Images of birds, animals and traditional symbols abound. Every year, people hasten to the area around Confucius Temple on the banks of the Qinhua River to see what will feature this time. Turn a corner and perhaps a dragon of light awaits you. Around another bend might be a lion dance or a stilt walker. Food abounds in the huge variety of restaurants and takeout vendors, and you will also be tempted with many different beverages; a hot drink is just what you will need to stave off the cold night air. Be warned! You will not be alone. This popular event is irresistible, and people come from all over Nanjing, and even surrounding towns, to be part of this glorious spectacle. The crowds that flood the area around Confucius Temple, the river, lanes and walkways, mean that movement is slow. But then who is in a hurry with so much to look at? Indeed, you may be carried along, armpit to armpit, trapped in what the locals call "people mountain, people sea," which of course means massive crowds.



Getting there is not a problem these days, as Nanjing Metro Line 3 has Fuzimiao Station for maximum convenience. If a Didi car or a taxi is your preference, at times you will need to be extremely patient with demand being high later in the evening.

The ancient folklore of "whipping the spring ox" is one of the most eye-catching scenery in Jiangsu. Wansui Monkey Lanterns Show in Changzhou

Wansui Monkey Lanterns Show originated in the Baitudun Village of Wansui, Menghe Town, Xinbei District, Changzhou City. It is a form of folk dance and acrobatics performed by people dressed as monkeys instead of real lanterns, and has been passed down for more than 300 years in the land of Menghe.Nowadays, Wansui Monkey Lanterns is often performed during major festivals or temple fairs. During the performance, the actors are dressed as monkeys in special masks, hats and clothes, awe-inspiring all the way with a deafening sound of gongs and drums.

city and the reflection of its history and culture. These museums have different themes. They are beautiful and charming, recording the mysteries of history as well as the changes of the times. They present the attitude of the locals in Jiangsu toward life, highlighting the essence of regional culture. In this chilly weather at the end of the year, let's go to these museums to feel the warmth of history, appreciate the signs of creation, and search for the roots of Jiangsu.

Entering the Nanjing Museum, you can see national treasures such as the "Stringed Jade Ornaments' from the Neolithic period, "Golden Beasts" from the Western Han Dynasty, the mold-printed brick painting of the "Seven Sages of the Bamboo Forest and Rong Qiqi" from the Southern Dynasties, and the "Underglazed Red Plum Vase with Design of Pine, Bamboo and Prunus" from the Ming Dynasty. Walking into the white-walled Suzhou Museum, you can touch the cultural temperament of Jiangsu. This museum with distinctive regional characteristics was designed by the world-famous Chinese-American architect I.M. Pei, who is originally from Suzhou, and has become a symbol for the world to know Suzhou.

Located on the bank of Haohe River, the Nantons Museum was founded in 1905 by Zhang Jian, a famou patriotic industrialist and scholar of the late Qing Dy nasty. As one of the earliest public museums in China Nantong Museum is also a garden where one can enjoy beautiful flowers and scenery while highlighting the mil lennial culture and humanistic charm of Jiangsu, which distinguishes it from the other general museums. The China Grand Canal Museum in Yangzhou is the first thematic museum nationwide that comprehensively displays the Grand Canal of thousands of years old. 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A Monster of a Museum in the Southern Capital

Before we get started, it should be noted that the Nanjing Museum will demand at least a full day of your time. For the place is colossal and its exhibits plentiful to say the least. So pack a lunch and wear comfortable shoes fit for a good walk. It's time for a visit to one of but only three national-level museums in all of China.



Getting there

The Nanjing Museum is 300 meters from Exit 1 of Minggugong Station on Nanjing Metro Line 2.

Dating back to 1933, and with its great hall in the style of a Liao Dynasty palace, the Nanjing Museum's 70,000 square metres of area makes it one of the biggest museums in China, while its collection also ranks up there. There are over 430,000 items in the museum's permanent collection alone (only the Palace Museum in Beijing has more), among which the Ming and Qing imperial porcelain collection is also one of the world's largest. A total of 12 exhibition halls comprise the Nanjing Museum, specifically devoted to pottery, copper ware, jade, porcelain, paintings & calligraphy, documents, gold & silver, lacquerware, embroidery, ethnic artefacts, folk art and others. Therein, some artefacts were discovered in Jiangsu Province, while some come from

collected by royal families and those from archaeological excavations; bronze ware, jade, ceramics, gold and silver utensils.

Visitors will see stunning artworks made from bamboo, wood, ivory and rhinoceros horns; lacquerware, textiles and embroideries, calligraphy, paintings and official

As explicit witness to the evolution of Chinese civilization over thousands of years, the artefacts in the Nanjing Museum are among the nation's most important cultural assets and a prerequisite for the museum's academic research. One such good example would be the walls made of bricks from the Northern and Southern Dynasties, dating back to 420 C.E.

Coming right up to date is the Digital Gallery, which breaks the traditional display mould of display boards in glass cases. Here, an important Chinese art masterpiece, "Story of the Grand Capital," is digitally animated and projected onto textured backgrounds. Elsewhere, the era of the Republic of China is given special attention in a life-sized Republic of China street scene, admittedly a little kitsch but nevertheless a good photo





opportunity popular with cosplay fans. It is also nicely complimented by the exhibit, Impression of Nanjing: Photo Exhibitions of the Republic of China (1912-1949), which charts well the development and changes of Naniing. For this Chinese New Year of the Tiger, the Nanjing Museum has specially gathered cultural relics of the twelve zodiacs. Showing in the Erudition Hall of the Arts Gallery on the museum's second floor, the exhibition opened on Dec. 28, 2021. Other temporary exhibitions taking place at the moment comprise "The Glamour of the Song and The Spiritual Word of Scholar Officials" (until March 22), "Beautiful Calligraphy and Wonderful Language: Special Exhibition on Qing Dynasty Couplets" (until June), "Everlasting Spirit Makes Time Meaningful: Exhibition on Fu Baoshi's Donated Works" (until June), "Orthodox Painting - Fine Art Exhibition

Take in a Touch of **SUZHOU SOUL**

A true highlight of Suzhou, the city's museum is one of the most visited in the world, with its unique architecture that serves as a hint of what is to come as visitors approach. For the Suzhou Museum touches the city's very soul; traditional white stucco walls adorned by sloping black roofs and, here and there, a splash of grey.

The Suzhou Museum is a 12-minute taxi ride from Suzhou Railway Station, a 15-minute ride from Suzhou Industrial Park Railway Station and a 25-minute ride from Suzhou North Railway Station.







ompleted in 2006, with architecture by Chinese-American and Pritzker Prize-winning, I.M. Pei, who lived in Suzhou during his childhood, the museum covers a wide area of 10,700 square meters.

Therein, over 40,000 historical and cultural relics, including, but not limited to bronze, calligraphy, ceramics, handcraft, ivory, jade, paintings and stone.

The ceramics exhibition is of a particularly of high standard. Therein, the 1,100-year-old Olive Green Lotus-Shaped Bowl, actually a local

find, from the third floor of Yunyansi Pagoda on Suzhou's Tiger Hill, is one of the museum's most precious items. Over the calligraphies section, and almost as old, there lies a national treasure. Dating back to the Yuan Dynasty, the Scroll of Seven Bamboo Paintings measures some 10 meters by 36.5 centimeters. Its value is thought to be in excess of 100 million yuan. Then there is the special hall exhibiting folk art collections. Visitors shall appreciate the many interesting items and scenes of daily life in ancient Suzhou, from that of ordinary people to the officials" court.

CHINA GRAND CANAL MUSEUM

A recorder of civilization next to the world heritage

As the north-south transportation artery in ancient China, the Grand Canal has been flowing for more than 2,500 years. Built in 486 B.C., the 2,700-kilometer-long Grand Canal spans across eight provinces and municipalities, including Beijing, Tianjin, Hebei, Shandong, Henan, Anhui, Jiangsu, and Zhejiang, etc. In 2014, the Grand Canal was transcribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List, becoming China's 46th world heritage project.







The Yangzhou section of the Grand Canal flowing through Jiangsu is 125 kilometers long and is arguably the oldest section of the entire Grand Canal, Studies have shown that the route through Yangzhou now coincides with that of the ancient canal to a great extent. The China Grand Canal Museum (CGCM) is located in the "Sanwan Area" (literally meaning Three Bays) of Yangzhou, where dense historical sites and cultural landscapes related to the Grand Canal are gathered. In recent years, public facilities have been built one after another in the Sanwan Area, including Yangzhou Sanwan Wetland Park, Sanwan Sports Park and Sanwan City Bookstore, making the area an important cultural tourist attraction and leisure place for the locals in Yangzhou City.

The overall design of the museum adopts the architectural style of the Tang Dynasty, which dates back more than 1,000 years, presenting modern, smooth and stylish lines, like a giant ship setting sail. It consists of five parts: the pavilion, the inner court-yard, the square in front of the museum, the tower and the bridge. The current collection contains more than 10,000 exhibits (sets) of various types of cultural relics from 500 B.C. to contemporary times, reflecting the theme of the canal, such as ancient documents, paintings, calligraphy, inscriptions, ceramics, metalware, and miscellaneous items.



In the exhibition hall of "The Grand Canal of China - A World Cultural Heritage Site," the 25.7-meter-long, 8-meter-high river profile shows the changes in the canal over the centuries; the 10-meter-high granary model demonstrates the importance of canal navigation to the country's economic development and people's daily life.

The exhibition hall of "Impressions of the Grand Canal Street" was designed to recreate the city's historical landscapes, combining historical scenes and real businesses. Here, the visitors can interactively experience the historical landscape of the towns along the Grand Canal with a history of thousands of years.

The museum also houses the 135-meter-long "Epic Scroll of the Grand Canal of China," on which 15 calligraphers and artists spent a year and a half painting the 2,500-year-long history of the Grand Canal's excavation and development, presenting the natural scenery and prosperity of the four seasons along the canal.

The exhibition called "Major World Canals and Canal Cities" showcases models

and pictures of weirs, tunnels, locks and other hydraulic structures of 15 representative canals, including six World Heritage canals, and highlights the human wisdom in the selection of paths and construction methods as well as operation and management of these canals.

The exhibition "Wetland Wonders" is mainly for children and is highly participatory, presenting the ecological connotation of the canal for over 2,000 years and exploring the mysteries of the canal wetland in an interactive way. In the "Long Canal, Diversified Wetlands" section, there is a colorful display of the natural landscape, ecological environment, wetland profile, plant and animal species of the area through which the canal flows. The "Paradise for Fish and Birds" is located at the center of the exhibition hall. Through the restored wetland scenes, the wetland ecology such as still-water animals and plant communities, plankton communities, benthic communities and submerged plant communities are vividly displayed, supplemented by the introduction of relevant wetland knowledge.



t the heart of Nantong city's old downtown, in Jiangsu Province, ere is an area that stands out from its busy and crowded urban surroundings, by offering an atmosphere of peace and retreat in the middle of the city.



National 5A Tourist Attraction, the Haohe Scenic Area, distinctive for its beauty, with no shortage of places to enjoy, such as water canals, bridges, gardens, pavilions, alleyways and traditional buildings, also includes its most important and historically relevant that is the Nantong Museum. The museum was founded during the Qing Dynasty, specifically on Jan. 14, 1905, by the illustrious Nantong native, Zhang Jian, regarded as the Number One Scholar of the Imperial Exam in the late Qing Dynasty. Zhang was also a well-known modern Chinese educator, entrepreneur, social activist and industrialist. The ,useum initially covered an area of 23,300 square meters and was later expanded to 71,800 square meters, of which the majority is dedicated to botanical gardens and pavilions. The museum itself is composed of five halls. The main hall at the entrance of the complex presents a very detailed explanation of the geological and geographical situation of the entire area of Nantong, the jurisdiction of which includes the cities



The first gallery introduces us to how geological movements shaped the area, from banks of sand and scattered inlets 5,000 years ago, to the land as we know it today. Samples that provide evidence of early human settlements dating back to the Neolithic Era in this area, such as ceremonial carved bones and pottery, are on display. All this gives way to the introduction of the first industrial activities. From salt fields harvesting in the early Han Dynasty to the production of what was considered at that time some of the finest cotton in the entire country, attracting traders from as far as Guangzhou and even other countries, created the reputation that stands today as an area of textile industry excellence. Early examples of textiles, machinery, production methods, and most importantly, the economic and cultural impact of these activities, are also on display. The following gallery emphasizes the impact and significance of the cultural diversity in the area, thanks to the presence of foreigners attracted by the booming industrial and economic activity in Nantong. Witness a melting pot of art, crafts, literature, education, and even religion, made evident by the rich amount of fine pottery, calligraphy, carving, embroidering, iewelry and religious artifacts.

Take the stairs to the second floor, and

you will find a gallery entirely dedicated to the legacy of the man who was responsible not only for the foundation of the Nantong Museum, but also considered a fundamental actor in the cultural, industrial and economic development of modern Nantong, playing a fundamental role in the reconstruction efforts after the Chinese People's War of Resistance against Japanese

A comprehensive collection of photos, magazines, books, documents, and objects offer a testimony Zhang's prolific activity, not least among which as president or founder member in the creation of 15 educational institutions, some of which are ranked today as among the top universities in China. Exiting the main hall building there is a small gift shop offering beautifully crafted souvenirs, while there is also an additional gallery hosting an exhibition for the occasion of the Chinese New Year celebration which displays examples of derivative uses of the tiger symbology. This exhibition will be open to the public for ten days from Jan.

Changing the tone of the tour and right across the exit of the main hall, a rather nice surprise is waiting inside another hall that hosts a collection of animals representing the bio-diversity of this part of the Yangtze River Delta. Fossils, seashells, small crustaceans, cephalopods, birds, fishes and mammals are shown, topping it all with life-

size whale and dolphin skeletons hanging from the roof of the main gallery. It's a delight to look at, especially if you are visiting with children

Leaving the "Ode To The Great Whales" exhibition hall, turn to the right to find what is with no doubt one of the most impressive and well-maintained botanical gardens you will ever visit. Specimens of trees, plants and flowers are carefully labeled and cataloged, the grass is spotless, while ancient relics, sculptures, utilitarian objects, decorative rocks and garden paths enhance the beauty. Additionally, scattered pavilions provide a place to rest and enjoy the intense fragrance that some of the blooming trees expel. The garden in itself is without question a must visit. Adjacent to the botanical garden in the northwest corner of the museum complex is located the "Haonan Villa," a mansion which was the former residence of Zhang. The main living-room by the entrance contains some of the original furniture of the house, while the rest of the rooms on the first floor are plastered with a collection of photographs and prints that depict in deeper detail the life and achievements of Zhang Jian.

The Nantong Museum in itself is not short of accolades, its recognitions include being one of the oldest museums in the entire country and the first public museum in the style of classical gardens in China.

All the text in the exhibitions on the first floor of the main hall is presented in Chinese and English. Not the case for the exhibitions on the second floor where only Chinese is available. There is also a guided tour service for the entire main hall which is also exclusively in Chinese. The same is for the Haonan Villa where all the text is in Chinese. In the natural life hall, the texts are also bilingual.

We all want you to enjoy your stay in Jiangsu as much as possible. During these trying times, however, it makes sense for us to continue to be vigilant. Visitors are reminded that China has implemented the "dynamic zero-case policy."

- Ensure you have the necessary COVID-19 health checks in place
- > Follow the directions of authorities as to epidemic prevention
- Carry a copy of your COVID-19 vaccination certificate, if available
- ➤ Wear a face mask throughout your journey by plane, train or on any other public transport
- ➤ Reserve suitable accommodation at a local hotel which accepts foreigners
- Download and set up APPs useful for making mobile payments, e.g. AliPay
- ➤ Check the validity of your passport and China visa

Also Good to Know...

- Foreigners do no longer require to get their train ticket in advance at most railway stations in Jiangsu. Station turnstiles are equipped with passport readers; buying a ticket online is sufficient.
- ➤ If you require a tax invoice for your train ticket, the paper ticket will suffice, and can be obtained in the ticket office. Car -hailing platforms now have dedicated pick up spots at railway stations, usually in the car park. Car -hailing drivers are not permitted to pick up passengers at the drop off point.
- Each metro system in Jiangsu has its own APP for seamless ticket purchase which can be swiped at the barrier upon exit and entry. Station staff will be happy to assist in setting up the APP if necessary. Many cities" metro systems also accept payment by WeChat and/or Alipay.
